As we advance the development of the Four Creeks Wind Project, we are committed to using local labor and supporting local businesses. As a demonstration of this commitment, we recently signed Memorandums of Understanding with 3 local unions - Laborers Local 165, International Union of Operating Engineers (IUOE) Local 649, and International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers (IBEW) Local 34.

Your Questions Answered

Who is responsible for decommissioning the Four Creeks Wind Project at the end of its operational life?

Our land agreements state that project is responsible for the decommissioning and removal of the Four Creeks Wind infrastructure at the end of the project's life. Standard decommissioning practices include dismantling all above ground components, repurposing, salvaging, recycling, or disposing of them, and restoring the land back to its original condition.

In addition to providing a decommissioning and restoration plan with our special use permit application, we are committed to putting financial security in place with Peoria County to ensure the host communities and landowners bear no financial responsibility for decommissioning or restoration at the end of the project's life.

We also are committed to high decommissioning standards and proper financial security through an Agricultural Impact Mitigation Agreement (AIMA) with the Illinois Department of Agriculture and a decommissioning agreement with Peoria County as required by the County's wind ordinance.
